RULES AND GUIDELINES

General Information

Entry Form Deadline: **Saturday, April 5th by 5 PM**, unless otherwise noted. There is also a drop box at the Fairgrounds Office for your convenience. Entry Limit is 2 per class unless otherwise specified.

Entry Rules - Please Read Carefully

- All classes, unless otherwise specified, are open to residents of Alpine, Amador, Calaveras, and Tuolumne counties.
- Unless otherwise stated, Divisions listed in the book will be open to amateur exhibitors only as defined in the State Rules.
- 3. No late entries will be accepted.

 Entry form must be physically at the fairgrounds by the closing date.
- Exhibits must have been made or prepared solely by the exhibitor and completed within one year of the opening day of the Fair, unless otherwise stated.
- Management reserves the right to cancel entries and cash awards and request the removal of exhibits from the grounds where exhibitors are objectionable or disturbing the public or other exhibitors.
- Entry forms must have the original signature of the exhibitor (or guardian).
- 7. All entries in the Junior Departments must have the original signature of the leader, Agriculture instructor or parent/guardian (whichever is applicable).
- 8. Presentation of completed entry form shall be deemed acceptance of all rules.
- Incomplete or incorrect entry forms may be returned at the discretion of management and is not responsible for errors in entry forms which may lead to elimination or disqualification of an entry.

- 10. The "Any other" class is ONLY for items that do not fit a specified category. It is not an overflow for an item that there is already a class for.
- 11. All the material used in decorating booths, racks, or exhibits must comply with State Fire codes.
- 12. All reasonable care will be taken to prevent loss or damage to exhibits, but in no event will the 39th District Agricultural Association be responsible for damage that may occur.
- 13. For all Amateur Adult work there will be a \$1.00 entry fee. Cash awards will be given for 1^{st} (\$5), 2^{nd} (\$3), and 3^{rd} (\$2).
- 14. The placement of ribbons does not guarantee correct placing in judging. Only the official placing on the judging sheet will constitute the final placement. Cash awards will be paid based on the signed judging sheets.
- 15. Unless otherwise stated, Sweepstakes Awards will be figured on the basis provided in the State Rules.
- 16. Most junior (Youth & Teen) exhibits are judged Danish. The Danish system judges against a standard (there could be several 1st places, etc.). Adults are judged by the American system of judging.
- 17. The judge's decision is final and cannot be protested. Protests may be considered if there has been a violation of State or Local rules. A copy of the protest policy is available in the administration office.







Rules

- Entries must be from different batches
- All entries must be home prepared by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair.
- Opened jars may be picked up immediately following judging, Saturday May 10th
- Due to storage limitations, the Fair will not be responsible for loss, spoilage, etc., if not picked up
 in a timely manner
- All jars must be in a standard jar and sealed. No paraffin seals. No freezer preserves. However, wax peppers do not have to be sealed
- A STANDARD JAR is a container specifically designed for canning purposes
- Jars must be sealed with new rings and screw lids
- Fruit, vegetables & pickles may be in quart or 1-pint jars
- Jams, jellies, preserves or marmalades may be in 1-pint, ½ pint or ¼ pint jars
- Entries are to consist of two jars or bottles (same size) of each product entered. One jar will be opened for judging, the other will be displayed
- No decorated jars
- Entry jars labeling All entries must be labeled securely on bottom of all jars. Label must include:
 the product name, the date of preservation, the canning method used (Example: use 'WB' for
 water bath canning, 'ASC' for atmospheric steam canning, and 'PC' for pressure canning), and the
 Division and Class. The name of the exhibitor must not be on the label.
- Health Requirements for Preserved Foods: All low-acid food (all vegetables, meats, poultry, and fish) must be canned under pressure. Low-acid fruit, such as figs, must be made more acidic by adding lemon juice as directed in the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning. High-acid foods, including acidified tomatoes, fruits, pickles, and relishes, may be canned in boiling water bath canner or atmospheric steam canner. Food preserved using the open-kettle, inversion, oven or microwave methods of canning will not be accepted. Dehydrated meats, including jerky, must have recipe attached to entry indication temperature used to dry meats. USDA research has shown that dried meats must reach a temperature of 165 degrees to kill bacteria




